

10m AIR PISTOL

Before the competition:

- Your eye protection
- Your hearing protection
- Stopwatch
- Targets
- Patches
- Range Incident Forms

Preparation and competition:

Check the range is clear of personnel, call...

“PREPARATION TIME BEGINS NOW”

- Start stopwatch
- (for competition) check:
 - Shooters in the correct bays,
 - Pistols and other equipment approved
 - Shooters wearing Start Numbers if provided

After 10 (ten) minutes, reset stopwatch, and call...

“START”

- Start stopwatch

For the **60-shot** event:
At 95 minutes, call...

“TEN MINUTES”

At 100 minutes, call...

“FIVE MINUTES”

At 105 minutes, call...

“STOP. UNLOAD”

For the **40-shot** event:
At 65 minutes, call...

“TEN MINUTES”

At 70 minutes, call...

“FIVE MINUTES”

At 75 minutes, call...

“STOP. UNLOAD”

At the end of the relay and all personnel have returned:

- **Announce the bay numbers for the trigger check**
- Random Trigger Weight checks
- Clear all pistols for casing and removal
- Complete Range Report, and forward to Classification Office

Targets

- ISSF 10m Air Pistol Target
- Targets are scored in the Classification Office



**Course of Fire
Preparation Time**

- 10 minutes

Competition series

- **60-shots** in 1 hour 45 minutes (105 minutes), including unlimited sighters before the first competition shot,
- **40-shots** in 1 hour 15 minutes (75 minutes), including unlimited sighters before the first competition shot,



- For 10m Air Pistol, shooters clear their own malfunctions. No additional time is granted unless the shooter claims the pistol needs to be repaired or replaced (6.12.1, 6.12.2).
- **Sighting shots** may only be fired before the first competition shot
- Shooters must 'hand in' the competition targets each 10 shots
- Shooters must leave their pistols at the firing line until the completion of the relay.
- In all cases, the Range Officer must clear the pistol before it may be removed from the firing line.
- The changing of gas cylinders may not be done at the firing line. Any pistol that is to be removed from the firing line must be cleared by the Range Officer
- After the shooter's first competition target is at the target line, any dry-firing that releases propellant will be counted as a scoring shot
