

Mayleigh Cup – Australian Conditions

While the Mayleigh Cup competition is an International Team competition, the competition format is included in the PA approved matches as an individual match.

Before the competition:

- Your eye protection
- Your hearing protection
- Stopwatch
- Targets
- Patches
- Score sheets (Registers)
- Be familiar with operation of the timer

Preparation and sighting series”

Check the range is clear of personnel

“PREPARATION TIME BEGINS NOW”

- Start stopwatch
- (for competition) check:
 - Shooters in the correct bays,
 - Pistols and other equipment approved
 - Shooters wearing Start Numbers if provided

After 10 (ten) minutes, stop stopwatch, and call...

“SIGHTING SERIES ... ”START” for stationary targets (or **“ATTENTION”** and activate the targets).

After 5 (five) minutes, call...

“STOP ... UNLOAD”

- Clear all pistols
- Allow scoring personnel forward

Competition series:

Check the range is clear of personnel

“FIRST (or 2nd, 3rd) SERIES ... START” for stationary targets (or **“ATTENTION”** and activate the targets).

After 10 (ten) minutes, call...

“STOP ... UNLOAD”

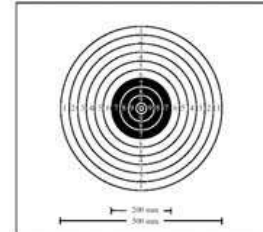
- Clear all pistols
- Allow scoring personnel forward

At the end of the relay and all personnel have returned:

- Clear all pistols for casing and removal
- Complete Range Report, and forward to Classification Office

Targets

- ISSF 25/50m Precision Pistol Target



25 Meter and 50 Meter Precision Pistol Target

Course of Fire

Preparation Time

- 10 minutes

Sighting series

- 5-shots in 5 minutes

Competition series

- Three series, each 10-shots, each in 10 minutes



Targets may be arranged:

- As per ‘Australian Conditions for 50M Pistol; i.e. Competition target above, sighting target below, or
- To save the need for personnel to go to the target line to change targets in sets of four; top left = competition target #1; top right = target #2; lower left = sighting target; lower right = target #3, or
- For ranges with Pit Marking, use the existing system as for International 50M Pistol
- Target Numbering:
- Sighting targets to be clearly marked in the top right corner

Competition targets to be individually numbered (e.g. shooter number, or name AND series
